Sans teeth, sans eyes, sans taste, sans everything. In William Shakespeare's *As You Like It*, the sad Jacques delivers these lines as a monologue in Act II, Scene vii. There is no rhyme scheme, however the whole poem is in Shakespeare's signature iambic pentameter. The speech compares the world to a stage and life to a play and catalogues the seven stages of a man's life, sometimes referred to as the seven ages of man: infant, schoolboy, lover, soldier, justice, Pantalone, and old age, facing imminent death.
