WHO WE ARE

Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre sit at the cultural heart of Scotland and the City of Dundee. Founded in 1929, the Rep building is a centre of creative energy, a space for engagement with a wide range of art forms, while also playing a lead role in arts education and engagement across the city and beyond. Proud of its Scottish roots, the Company looks outwards, producing dance and theatre of national and international significance, for and with a diverse audience.

Sited in a purpose-built art space, Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre create and deliver work for a local audience, as well as on a national and international scale.

The model is unique. Two creative forces share a home and a legal structure. Having a permanent acting ensemble is rare (unique in Scotland), but combined with a dance company and extensive creative learning, it makes the Rep building one of a kind and a hub of creative energy.

At the heart of the Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre vision is the belief that artistic and creative experiences of the highest quality should be seen and available to all. Two companies exist under one legal structure, governed by one Board of Directors with a breadth of skills and professional interests.

Since 1979 Dundee Rep Ensemble has been Scotland's only permanent company of full-time actors who created award-winning productions, establishing a reputation as one of the UK's foremost theatre companies.

Scotland's principal contemporary dance company, Scottish Dance Theatre, was established at the Rep in 1988 and is a valued research engine for dance, pioneering new ways to create and distribute work across all scales, that company commissions permanent artists in many fields whose practice is outstanding and secured in its relationship with the audience.



Alongside both companies' work is an extensive programme of Creative Learning opportunities which engage communities and schools on a local and national scale.
